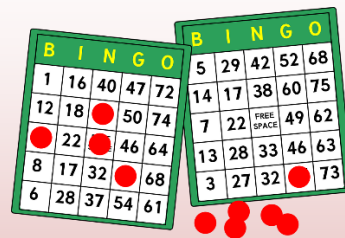

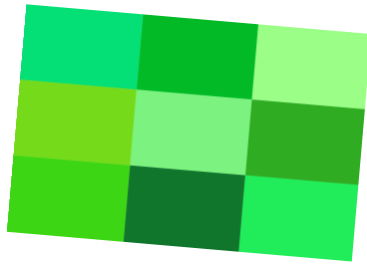

Confirmation

Sixth Class pupils will celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation on this coming Saturday, March 10th. The Parents' Association are hosting a reception for the Confirmation pupils and their families in the school hall immediately after the ceremony. It is traditional for the parents of Fifth Class pupils to donate some baked goods, cakes, buns, biscuits etc that can be used for the reception. Items can be dropped into the Halla on Friday before 3.30pm or on Saturday from 11am. Parents of First Class pupils traditionally donate items for reception for First Communion which takes place this year on Saturday April 21st.

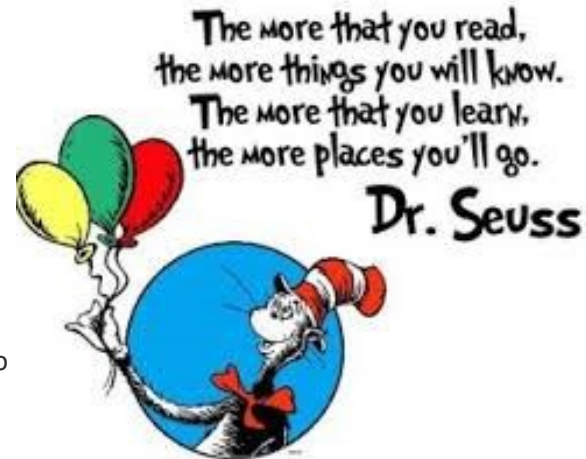


Second and Fourth Class pupils are using Mathletics. The school has paid a subscription to allow each pupil to access this wonderful Maths website. Mathletics is a captivating online Maths programme which provides children with stimulating and motivating games to improve their mathematical ability. Many pupils log on at home even when they haven't been given homework to try and achieve their weekly certificate. Many of the challenges allow pupils to play against other pupils in our school as well as pupils from other schools. Progress is tracked and you can see how pupils are progressing in every area. Encourage your children to use Mathletics at home and check in on their progress.



Third and Fifth Classes participate in the Accelerated Reader (AR) program, an online programme that motivates pupils to read and helps them improve their reading skills. Pupils are encouraged to read books which are at an appropriate level for them and then to take on online comprehension assessment. As a result, pupils are able to enjoy reading books which interest them and which are at their comprehension level. This has the benefit of improving pupils' attitudes towards reading and encouraging them to read more frequently.

Each pupil has their own login password for AR. Parents can login to this account and view the pupil's virtual bookshelf of the books they have read and also their progress on the comprehension assessments. Please encourage your children to use AR.

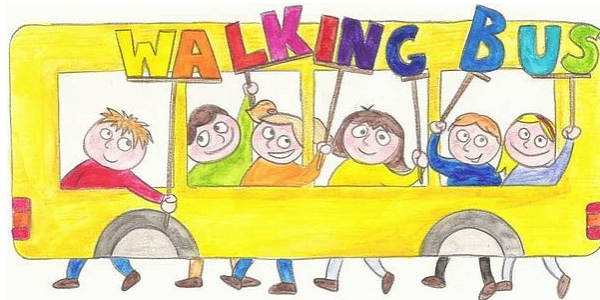
